## **Minister's letter**

If you work, or recently worked, for a large organisation you may be familiar with the idea of "benchmarking": comparing your organisation's performance against similar ones to see if you could do better. Generally it is good idea to do this before you embark on a new enterprise, but it can still be instructive half-way through. After Kirkland Mission gained its Bronze Eco Church award we had the opportunity to hear a presentation from Lorton Church which has its Gold Eco Church award, one of very few in Cumbria to have achieved that level. What they did right at the outset was to *involve* the local community, not just *inform* them. As a result, several key members of the group that worked on the project were not church goers, but happy to contribute to environmental improvement in their local area.

Is there anyone like that in Lamplugh or Ennerdale, or indeed Kirkland? There is still some work to be done to make Kirkland's grounds more bee and butterfly friendly, though we made a start last year in turning the sloping areas into a wildflower meadow. Lamplugh and Ennerdale have yet to begin the process of seeking Eco Church status, and because their congregations are smaller than Kirkland, they will struggle to establish a working group on their own. They also both have church yards where burials are continuing, so sensitivity to local feelings must be a major consideration before turning any area within them over to wildlife.

If anyone in any part of the parish would like to be involved in the next stage of the church's Eco journey, or has ideas about how the church could help parishioners 'green' their own lifestyle, please get in touch with me. The Church of England has committed itself to becoming carbon neutral by 2030. This is an ambitious target; if the parish is to pull its weight, we shall need all the help we can get. Iaw Parker

#### Going Green Gracefully No. 15

#### "The greatest threat to the planet is the belief that someone else will save it"

I hope we are all trying to avoid single use plastic items where we can. The Government is currently consulting on banning a number of single use plastic items including plates, cups and cutlery. If you are quick (the deadline is February 12<sup>th</sup>) you can contribute to the consultation as a member of the public by going to :

https://consult.defra.gov.uk/environmental-quality/consultation-on-

proposals-to-ban-commonly-littered/consultation/ The first few questions are about the definition of various types of plastic, which will obviously be essential for any legislation, but I answered 'don't know' because I'm not an industrial chemist. Then you get the opportunity to say what you think about the proposed ban. At the end there are a lot of questions directed at industries which produce these items and business which use them. You are free to miss these questions out; provided you scroll to the end and click on 'submit', your responses to the general principles of the proposed ban will be counted.

It is pointed out that paper plates and cups, and wooden cutlery are already available as alternatives to single use plastic items, but I find eating a much more pleasant activity when it is from a solid plate, and using metal cutlery, which can be washed up and used again and again!

#### Real Easter Eggs

There are still more than two and a half months until Easter, and Lent doesn't start until the beginning of March, but we have already been notified about this year's 'Real Easter Eggs' The 'classic egg' which is what people have mostly ordered before is priced at £4.50. It comes with a newly designed 24 page Easter story activity book with a prize competition, is made from Fairtrade milk chocolate (150g) and is palm oil and plastic free. There are also plain chocolate, white chocolate and 'special Edition' versions available at higher prices.

I'll be taking orders until the end of February. If we can get enough orders by then we'll qualify for free delivery. *Ian Parker*

#### Why I love Café Church

Well! It's in the name, isn't it?!!

When Jim Marshall, the previous Vicar at Lamplugh and District churches, left for pastures new, along came Vicar Ian. He started making pastoral visits around the Kirkland, Lamplugh and Ennerdale communities to introduce himself and welcome folk into the three churches in our area.

When Ian visited me, we had a good natter, me explaining that I wasn't a very "churchy" person; I was brought up as a Christian, but for whatever reason, found traditional church services a bit difficult and uninspiring, and therefore didn't attend many. I explained this to Ian, who suggested that I come along to a new kind of service, held once a month, called Café Church. It was a service where tables were set out with four +/- people sitting around them - coffee, biscuits and the occasional cake on each table - and which started with a hymn and some prayer. Ian introduces a topic/issue which we discuss around the table for 10/15 minutes, and then feedback our thoughts about it to Ian and the other groups. The topics are wide-ranging, perhaps relating to a subject such as climate change and the human problems associated with it or how we can make our spending "count" in terms of helping our communities. It also covers topics such as how we can support people living with dementia, poverty, our own beliefs and faith, loneliness ... We then discuss the topic on our own table to discuss how we can help support individuals in our community or nation or our planet caught up in these issues.

The opportunity to discuss such issues in a relaxed and informal way is, a not-to-be-missed occasion once a month. Café Church is nonjudgemental, interesting and stimulating. At its heart is the Christian faith but it never dismisses the values of other beliefs. For me, it opened up "Church" again, and the opportunity to develop an open-minded approach to the problems, complexities and issues facing the world.

Most readers will be aware by now that there is a 4 day Bank Holiday weekend in the summer to encourage

people to celebrate the fact that her Majesty has reigned over us for 70 years. This article is to let you know that a group has been formed by representative of various organisations to co-ordinate activities in Lamplugh Parish. *(Ennerdale is also making plans, which you can read about elsewhere.)* 

We already know that there will be a Beacon lit on the Thursday evening by the Young Farmers on the fell above Dockray Nook. On the Saturday the Lamplugh sports will take place in the afternoon, and there will be a classic car run, ending at the sports field. Commemorative mugs will be presented to the children, and there will be a raffle to raise funds for events generally.

The following activities may have been confirmed by the time you read this, but the details were still uncertain at the time of the last meeting: a fun day at the playground in Kirkland on Friday, a social event on Saturday evening, an exhibition by the Lamplugh Heritage Society and a service at Lamplugh Church on Sunday.

Because there is no central place to organise a street party, the group is encouraging neighbours in places where houses cluster together (Crosgates, Felldyke, Lamplugh Green etc.) to organise their own. Nationally, the plan is to hold these on Sunday at lunchtime, but folk can arrange them at any time to suit.

It was felt to be good to have another Scarecrow Festival with the each scarecrow's costume reflecting one of the 7 decades since 1952, but no one has yet come forward to organise it. What's happening in the Village and what would you like to see happen?

In no particular order the following items from the meeting are as follows:-



Forestry wagons- Due sadly to the discovery of Larch disease in trees in the Ennerdale valley we may be seeing the return of the large log wagons

as the timber has to be removed from the area.

The Parish Council is pressing for a consultation, to ensure the wagons carry out their job safely and with minimal disruption.

Parking – It is understood that a road traffic order may be served which will result in yellow lines around the village area. Parking on the verges near the new Broadmoor "off road" path and Bleach Green approach is being looked at closely and we are watching any new developments at the two lakeside car parks as proposals are afoot to close Bleach Green and charge for parking at Bowness Knott.

The new Broadmoor "off road path" is proving a huge success and we are looking to sort out a few teething problems along the way. Further work to be carried out on resurfacing. Thank you for your positive response and patience.

Village facelift – The Parish Council is looking to spend money rejuvenating the village's appearance. We are looking to provide more benches, both in the village and along our pathways and planters with seasonal blooms. There are plans to make Bridge Park (the old children's play park) into a community quiet area with benches and planting. We are looking for suggestions ideas and help, maybe adopt a barrel and maintain it). Please contact clerk if you can help. Many thanks to residents who have offered to donate benches.

Jubilee – A sub group is looking to organise an event on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2022. Current thoughts are for a picnic with singer and events taking place in a central village field. We need your support and ideas. Please contact clerk (contact details below).

## Ennerdale Hub Limited.

At the start of a New Year we wanted to give an update on the Hub and Gather, and introduce the new Board, elected at the last A.G.M.

Under the rules of our society we can have up to 12 members and in the early days when we set about the first and then second priorities identified by the village – The Fox and Hounds and the village shop and community space, we had 12 with many others eager to sign up. This meant we had a wide range of knowledge, skills and experience to call upon from across the valley.

The families and networks of these members helped us to keep an ear to the ground to know what funds, grants, partnerships were available to meet the needs already identified and to respond to any changes in priorities.

The first job was to re-open the village pub-not to run it-, we did this in under 3 months and although we no longer hold the lease, the pub is still open and running, a far cry from October 2010.

The second job was to get a village shop, café and community space open. After further extensive community consultations, we got the funding and built this too. The project took just over 5 years to complete and it has now been open and running for over 5 years. The café and shop are well used and the community space upstairs hosts a wide range of activities for the community.

The core members of the Board over the first half of our 11 year history had invested a huge amount of time and energy and needed time to focus on their own lives and draw breath, although many of them have continued to support The Gather as volunteers.

Recently it has been difficult to recruit even the three Board members required by our rules and we have been so grateful to those who have stepped into the breach and done an amazing job in making sure we meet the requirements of the Ennerdale Hub Ltd., as laid down by the Financial Services Authority. As a community we need to share the load if we are to build on our success and keep addressing the needs of the village as we move forward, you will see this reflected in your new Board, which is made up of:

3 people who farm in the valley, but also have training and experience in other jobs.

5 founder members all of whom are involved in the Ennerdale Show Committee and/or Parish Council

1 new shareholder who joined in February 2021

1 who single-handedly carried the burden of the Secretary and Treasurer for the las 3 years.

The staff and volunteers at the Gather have raised the profile of the village and responded magnificently to the challenges of the Covid pandemic by developing online ordering, click and collect deliveries and even collecting and delivering prescriptions.

As a board we are beginning to look at some ongoing maintenance and start to plan more strategically going forward. If you have any skills and expertise that you can share, we would love to hear from you. We are looking to build a contact list of people in the community willing to give advice and support, from time to time, without the commitment of being a Board member or shareholder.

We would also like to meet the needs of everyone in the area, through our flexible room spaces, from schoolchildren who may need broadband access to do their homework, parents needing to get information from the school, to projects that are still to be imagined.

At this time of year we start to think about the mud drying up and getting out to walk in the beautiful English Countryside again, but where to find new and interesting walks?

Walking in Cumbria <u>https://www.walkinginengland.co.uk/cumbria</u> has hundreds of walks to download and print, free, it also has books of walks, details of all the walking groups in the county and much more. Whether you want to walk on your own or with a group all the information is there in one place.

John Harris (the custodian of the website) said 'There is so much walking information on the web but it is difficult to find. Walking in Cumbria (part of the Walking in England website – one for each county in England) has brought it together in one place so whether you are walking from home, or away on holiday, you will be able to find a walk suitable for you'.

## Martin Luthers wife.

Martin Luther was known to say "There is no more lovely, friendly and charming relationship, communion, or company than a good marriage. Martin Luther found peace when he married an ex-nun named Katherine von Bora whom he had helped to escape from her nunnery in an empty fish barrel and taken refuge in Wittenberg. She was born in 1499 and in 1504 went to the convent school of the Benedictine order in Brenhna and entered the convent of Nimbschen in 1508. In 1515 she took her vows and became a nun at the soonest possible date in 1523 and left the convent by 1525 This became a trend across Europe as former nuns and monks married and she became Mrs Martin Luther.

Katherine was 16 years younger than Martin and together they had six children. Martin doted on his large family and devoted himself to the simple pleasures of life like gardening and writing music. Katherine took over the household particularly the household expenses and proved herself to be a good housewife and gardener. Martin's household included not only his wife and six children but also one of Katherine's relatives and after 1529 six of Martin's sister's children. Students were also housed to help with the family's family's financial situation. The family enjoyed a type of playing bowls in their garden board games such as chess, and music.

They grew their own food in a small garden at the Black Cloister and then later at a farm outside Witterberg They had a pet dog. Martin Luther and Katherine were diligent parents, disciplining their children, but doing so in love. Their home was noted for its liveliness and its happiness. Katherine outlived her husband by six years. She died on December 20th 1552 in Torgau where she had fled from the plague in Wittenberg.
