Minister's Letter

I was reminded recently of research into the opinions of 16 to 25-year-olds in 10 different countries which was published in 2021. It revealed widespread fear of the future, particularly in relation to climate change. In the UK 73% of young people interviewed felt the future was frightening, while just over half actually thought humanity was doomed. 48% said that they had been dismissed or ignored when trying to talk about climate change*.

I find these statistics to be a judgement on my generation (the baby boomers). We were running the world in the 1990s and the early 2000s, when the scientific evidence became overwhelming, but the response of world leaders, both in politics and in business, was neither timely nor proportionate to the threat. Fine words and procrastination were the order of the day, no doubt linked to the unspoken belief that the worst consequences of our inaction would be after we were dead. Such a hope is not available to those who were born around the turn of the century.

There are many stories in the Bible of prophets who were sent by God to warn Kings and rulers of the dire consequences if they persisted in their current course of action. Generally, the prophets were ignored and disaster followed. In the modern age scientists may be likened to the prophets of old. The difference is that the leaders of nations and large corporations are not paying attention, but our young people are. That must be the cause of the fear and despair which were uncovered by that research project a few years ago.

We must encourage our young people to discover that although individually they may not be able to influence events at all, the voice of a whole generation when collectively raised can make a difference. Recent history is full of cases of governments pushed to take action by a public outcry, and Mega corporations forced to backtrack by a revolt of their customers or a high-profile scandal.

Make it a priority this summer when the young people are home from university and college to talk to them about how they view the future, and encourage them to engage in campaigning to change those things which they find unacceptable.

- Phases out investment in fossil fuels, deforestation and other harmful industries.

5 charities were awarded grants: Lamplugh with Ennerdale Parochial Church Council -£1,250; Lamplugh Sports Committee - £1000; Kirkland Children's Playground - £1,500; Lamplugh Village Hall Committee - £500; and Arlecdon and District First Responders - £250

Election of Chair and Vice-Chair: Roger Braithwaite was elected Chair and Ed Surman as Vice-Chair. It was noted that Michael Watts was resigning from the PC.

Parish Finances: A finance summary was presented by the clerk. Balance at 31st March 2025 was £13,399.44

Ennerdale and Kinniside Parish Council



Community Led Plan and Emergency Plan Cllr Ric Outhwaite writes:

The *E&K Parish Council* has for some time had an ambition to prepare a new *Community Led Plan* after the expiry of the previous one, and to also create and maintain an *Emergency Plan*.

What is a *Community Led Plan*? Well the idea is that it is a document prepared on behalf of the Community to help inform the community and anybody who is looking at the area about what we find important about our area and what we would like to see happen over the next 10 years.

The Community Led Plan can take account of all manner of things: housing and built development; roads; parking; traffic speeds; nature and conservation; footpaths and access to the countryside; activities and events; etc.

The important part of developing this plan is that it can take account of whatever the community feels it needs to, so *community engagement* is a key factor. This includes everyone within the Parish Council's boundaries - not just Ennerdale village but also Kinniside, Croasdale and the individual farms and outlying properties in the valley and on the fells.

In addition to the Community Led Plan, *E&K Parish Council* are developing a *Community Emergency Plan*. This plan guides how the community would pull together and what resources are available if part or all of the community was impacted by an emergency (for example, flooding or a fire, or a pandemic, etc.) The purpose of such a plan is to help to minimise the impact of such an emergency and to help our community to recover more quickly, thus increasing our resilience.

To engage with the community on both plans referred to above, we have established a small working group for the Community Emergency Plan, led by **Cllr Sandra Guise**. A separate working group for the Community Led Plan will be formed and led by **Cllr Ric Outhwaite**.

It is important for both working groups to also include a cross section of the community, so we would greatly appreciate hearing from anyone who feels they have something to offer, either in terms of their time or their knowledge. We live and work in a fabulous part of the world and are very lucky to have a National Park and a section of **Wainwright's Coast to Coast National Trail** right through the valley, so I hope that we can take the opportunities provided by better weather and longer days to fully appreciate and enjoy our surroundings.

On the topic of the National Trail, **Jo Willmott** of the **LDNPA** has once again put together an informative update on the works that have been going on in and around the Ennerdale Valley to upgrade the footpath and associated infrastructure. You will note that Forestry England have finally started the tree felling along the Broadmoor / Jubilee Trail section, so this will unfortunately be closed during working hours (with a diversion in place).

Another flyer that is doing the rounds is for the annual **Proms in the Playground** with the **Sethera Brass Band**, which will be at **Ennerdale Church of England Primary School** on **Friday 4th July at 6pm**. If the music and the community spirit isn't enough for you, do note that the ticket price also includes strawberries and cream or ice cream!

There are plenty of events to look forward to over the coming months, the biggest of which is of course the 117th running of the **Ennerdale Show**, which will be held at The Leaps Show Ground, Kirkland on **Wednesday 27th August 2025**. This long-running and traditional Lakeland show will once again feature sheep, horses, dogs, vintage machinery, hound trailing, fell races, Cumberland & Westmorland wrestling, and the delights of the industrial/produce marquee, and is well supported by many local businesses and vendors. Earlier in August will be the latest iteration of Ennerdale's "**Picnic in the Park**". This year it will be on Sunday 3rd August between 3pm and 5pm and will be held in the Memorial Park next to Ennerdale Bridge itself. **Diana Stewart** at The Shepherd's Arms is busy organising this, so anyone who can help her please get in touch.

August is also when we have the **Summer Bank Holiday**, which this year falls on **Monday 25th August**. This is towards the end of the peak holiday season but our area will still be busy with visitors. If you're planning on a meal during this busy period at any one of **The Ennerdale Brewery**, **The Countryman**, **The Shepherd's Arms** and **The Fox and Hounds** - all fantastic venues within our parish - then please make sure to make a reservation to avoid disappointment!

Elsewhere in this month's edition we have updates from both **Lamplugh Parish Council** and from **Ennerdale and Kinniside Parish Council**. E&K PC have recently initiated two working groups to start the process of creating a **Community Led Plan** for the village's future sustainable development and for the benefit of the whole community, and also with creating an **Emergency Plan** to help us prepare for unforeseen events in a rural area and to strengthen community resilience. If successful, Forestry England will engage with those likely to be affected by the proposals from this point.
